Just to update you on what has been happening at New Hope over the past few months so here goes.

Many of you will know that Annet spent a large part of 2013 in the United States receiving medical treatment for cancer and she returned to Uganda just before Christmas. She does not wish to make that journey again and is now very happy working for the children at the orphanage whom she regards as her family.

Just before Christmas in addition to the regular monthly support, we were also able to send a further £200. This was to be spent on those children who had nowhere else to go for Christmas and also on some of the poorest families who have children at New Hope in order to make the Day a little bit special. Early this year Annet heard about a number of children who had been abandoned by their parents. In a number of cases the fathers had remarried and the new wives had other children and did not want anything to do with the step children. Annet travelled to the region of Uganda to meet the children and on the 5th February twelve of them arrived to become the latest members of New Hope which is now their home. The children are so very happy and they now have new uniforms instead of just rags; however, it is essential that they get sponsored as soon as possible.

As you can see Annet and Godfrey continue to expand the work in spite of the difficulties they have faced and wish to thank you all for your support.
