


7. We held an all day celebration to honor New Hope Founder Annet Kayongo.

3. A site assessment was completed and needed items were purchased in Uganda.

Because you gave generously, we were able to immediately purchase needed items before we left Uganda!

- 47 mattresses, 71 blankets, 76 sheets, 6 buckets and 14 underwear for children \$1,903 • Boys' bathroom was in need of a major update - \$1,984
- Nursery's swing set and monkey bars needed repair \$120
- Classroom supplies requested \$121
- TV for the girls' dorm




Roger is working on lab enhancements.

4. Your investment in a computer lab is strengthening academic performance.



6. We made time for a safari and also dinner one evening at Lake Victoria.

We had an exciting adventure traveling to Murchinson Falls National Park. We spotted giraffes, elephants, antelopes, water buffalo, monkeys, and baboons from our van, then watched warthogs and a rare group of 10 white rhinos up close on a walking tour! It is also the site of Murchison Falls - easily one of the most breathtaking sites in the world!
